

## WHO MAY ENROLL

Kindergarten is a full-day program. Any University City child who is five years old before July 31, of the enrollment year is eligible.

## NEW ENROLLMENT GUIDELINES

Students who are new to the school or going from 2nd to 3rd grade are required to provide the following enrollment materials:

- ◆ Birth certificate (original, if not on file)
- ◆ Immunization record (current, if not on file)
- ◆ Photo ID (parent/guardian) *along with proof of guardianship if other than custodial parent.*
- ◆ Occupancy permit (*must list name of parent/guardian and student*)

Two of the following are also required for enrollment:

- ◇ Current unpaid utility bill (electric, gas, water, trash, sewer, phone, no cell phone)
- ◇ Voter registration card (current address)
- ◇ Current lease
- ◇ Property deed
- ◇ Real estate tax receipt (previous year)
- ◇ Personal property tax receipt (previous year)
- ◇ Receipt or payment stub from rent check (previous month)
- ◇ Current paycheck stub identifying employee name and address (less than one month old)

*Children entering kindergarten need to be five years old before August 1.*

## VISION STATEMENT

## KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS

Kindergarten is the first big step toward adjusting to a world other than your child's home and family. Many people will influence your child during this school year, most important being the kindergarten teacher. The teacher, in addition to the specialists in art, music, physical education and counseling, will teach and support your child's growth and development. Developing the potential in every student is the concern of all teachers and staff at Pershing.

## ENTERING KINDERGARTEN

The Developmental Indicators for the Assessment of Learning Third Edition (DIAL III) helps determine student' skill level and aid in smooth entry into kindergarten. Each child will be tested in the developmental areas of number concepts, language and cognitive skills, listening skills, paper/pencil skills, visual skills and large muscle skills.

Early Learning Center and Chapter I Pre-kindergarten students are given DIAL III during the month of May prior to kindergarten enrollment.

Kindergarten teachers focus on motor, language, auditory, visual/sensory experiences and cognitive growth. Successful learning is related to language and the ability to communicate with teachers and classmates. Two of the main academic areas vital to the kindergarten program are pre-reading and number skills.

## THE DAILY SCHEDULE

Our daily schedule is as follows:

Morning Bell .....8:40 a.m.  
 PM Dismissal.....3:30 p.m.

The first bell rings at 8:40 a.m. and all classes begin at 8:45 a.m. Children are to remain on the playground until the morning bell rings. When the bell rings they will line up on their room number. Students enter the building using the northeast door.

Students are not allowed at school before 8:30 a.m. In the event of inclement weather before school, kindergarten students are to report to room 113; grades 1, 2 and 3 go to the large gym, and grades 4, 5 and 6 go to the cafeteria.

## ABSENCE OR TARDINESS

If a child will be absent or tardy, please call the main office at 290-4152 before 9:30 a.m. This policy helps to guarantee the safety of your child from home to school.

## INCLEMENT WEATHER

If inclement weather or emergency situations occur and there is an adjustment in the starting time or dismissal time, the schedule will be announced on the following radio stations: KMOX 1120 AM, KMJM MAJIC 104.9 FM, KWMU 90.7 FM and television channels 2,4, 5 & 11. If school is dismissed early, make sure your child understands where to go in case a parent is not home.

## EARLY CLASSROOM DISMISSAL

No child from kindergarten through third grade may be excused from school unless picked up by one of the child's parents.

## LEAVING THE SCHOOLYARD

Children are not to leave the schoolyard without the teacher's permission. This policy is important to the safety of your child.

## PERSONAL MEDICAL NEEDS

A registered nurse is available every day to attend to your child's minor medical necessities. A teacher or an aide will refer children to the nurse. If the nurse determines that a child is ill and needs to go home, a parent will be called. The child will be kept at school until picked up by a parent or that parent's designated agent.

If a child needs to take prescription medication during school hours, the parent must fill out the appropriate form and return it to the school. This only applies to prescription medicine. If a parent wishes a child to be given over-the-counter medicine, s/he must come to the school and administer the medicine.

The nurse conducts distance vision testing during the year for children in kindergarten, first and third grades, and for new students in the second and fourth grades. If a problem is determined, parents will be notified and urged to have the child examined by a professional. In October of each year, all children in first, third and fifth grades are given a screening test to check hearing. Also, new children in second and fourth grades are tested.

## VISITORS

Visitors are welcome at Pershing. Please register at the office upon entering the school. If you wish to speak to your child's teacher the best way to make an appointment is by calling the school office so the meeting can be as productive as possible.

## CAFETERIA

A nutritional plate lunch is served daily in the cafeteria for \$1.55 including milk. The child pays the cashier daily, or arrangements may be made with the cafeteria manager to purchase a lunch plan for a certain number of meals. Reduced price or free lunches are available for children who qualify under federal guidelines.

Children may bring a bag lunch and eat in the cafeteria. Milk or juice may be purchased for 50¢. Children may not leave the school playground during the lunch period. A note must be brought from home to school if a child is to go home for lunch.

Breakfast is served to children who arrive between 8:20 and 8:30 a.m. for \$1.00. Reduced price /free breakfast is available for those who meet the federal requirements.

## CAFETERIA PROCEDURES

- Please give your name as you pass by the cashier.
- Students are encouraged to sit with their class.
- Each student is expected to clean his/her place.
- If you forget your money, notify your teacher and the cafeteria manager will provide you with a peanut butter sandwich lunch.
- You may purchase additional entrees or vegetables if you have eaten the school lunch.
- It is necessary to use inside voices and to walk at all times in the cafeteria.

## CONFERENCES AND REPORT CARDS

Parent/teacher conferences are held twice a year, in the 1st and 3rd quarters. At this time, parents will receive the child's report card and have the opportunity to discuss the child's academic and social progress with the teacher. Parents will also receive report cards in the 2nd and 4th quarters.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Additional reading, language development, and other resources are available to students at Pershing. Children who need additional assistance as indicated by test scores and teacher/parent recommendation, are referred to these programs. Assistance is available in speech therapy. These programs are offered through the School District of University City and the Special School District. For details, please contact the school office.

## GIFTED AND TALENTED EDUCATION (GATE)

The Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) program is for students in kindergarten through grade twelve who require more challenging enrichment and accelerated learning opportunities to realize their full potential. GATE integrates critical and creative thinking, independent research, and problem-solving curricular activities. The elementary site-based services will provide direct small group instruction, enrichment activities for students who demonstrate strengths and talents but do not meet the criteria for GATE, and begin piloting programs for students with special talents not typically supported by GATE.

## SACC (School Age Child Care)

SACC, School Age Child Care, formerly known as KEYS, Keep Every Youngster Safe provides a productive recreational and educational childcare experience at a reasonable cost before and after normal school hours. Children from kindergarten through fifth grade are eligible. Space is limited to 30 children. This program is operated by the city branch of the Monsanto YMCA, which determines the policies, staffing and program. Fees are structured for full time and part time care and are payable in advance every month. Financial assistance is available. For additional information and enrollment call 367-4646.

## LITERACY GOAL

Our goal is for every child at Pershing to read at least 50 books this school year. We encourage families to read at home every day for at least 20 minutes. Please make this a part of your daily homework and family routines. In addition it is our academic goal to have every student reading fluently by grade three.

## FIELD TRIPS

Students must have signed permission slips to attend planned field trips. Parents who chaperone field trips are not allowed to invite siblings from other grade levels on the trip.

## SCHOOL HONORS

Pershing is proud to be named a 1994 Missouri Gold Star School and a 1994 Nation-Wide Blue Ribbon School. Pershing was also chosen as a pilot school for the Missouri Multi-Media Interactive Network Technology Program in 1997. In 1999, Pershing was named one of the State's "most improved" schools in Missouri.

## GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING SERVICES

The elementary counseling program reaches all children through classroom guidance activities as well as small group sessions. The approach is developmental and preventive.

The school counselor, Ms. Michelle Williams, works with students to promote growth in the following areas: understanding of self and others, learning and using problem solving, decision-making, communication skills, cultivating the habit of self-examination and consideration of behavioral alternatives, career awareness, assuming responsibility for the child's own behavior, self-motivation and reaching maximum potential.

The guidance counselor is an integral part of the school program and works with all those involved in meeting the needs of the students. Emphasis is placed on group counseling and consultation.

The counselor offers the following services: classroom guidance, individual and small group counseling, crisis support, referral to outside agencies, consultation to parents and teachers to better help them understand the behavior or academic concerns of the child, parent workshops, test score interpretation, and provide and recommend materials and resources to meet the specific needs of students.

If you wish to consult with Ms. Williams about a problem concerning your child, please feel free to call the school office for an appointment. By working with the counselor, teacher, and principal to resolve a problem, your child's educational and social potential can be met.

## SCHOOL RULES FOR STUDENTS

Harmony and good will in the classrooms, halls, and on the playground help to promote a good educational and social atmosphere. Children at Pershing are expected to follow rules that will result in good feelings about themselves, other students, teachers and staff.

Students are expected to demonstrate respect for all adults and other students.

Any student will be allowed to play in any game, which is age appropriate.

During bad weather before school, children are to stay inside.

Meet younger brothers and sisters in the courtyard area. Skateboards are not allowed on the school grounds during school hours.

Enter the school through the northeast doors, not the front doors (except kindergartners).

Be on time for class and bring needed materials.

Climbing on the fence is not allowed.

Do not bring valuable or unnecessary items to school. This includes tape recorders, radios, cameras, jewelry, toys and expensive pieces of clothing, etc. All inappropriate items will be confiscated and may not be returned until the end of the school year.

Bring only the minimum amount of money necessary to buy lunch.

No coats, jackets or hats may be worn in classrooms.

All personal items should be clearly marked with the owner's name.

Walk quietly through the halls during school hours.

Stay on the school grounds during school hours.

Talk out differences or consult the counselor or your teacher. Fighting is not a sign of maturity, and regardless of who starts the fight students found fighting should expect a suspension. We expect peaceful coexistence and the safety of all students.

Balls are not to be thrown against the building.

Avoid playing in the front of the school.

Throwing snow, rocks, sticks, etc. is not allowed.

Games, groups, and conversations are to be confined to the major part of the playground.

## PARENT/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES

At Pershing, parents and teachers work together in many areas to insure the successful development of your child's potential and academic success. Parents and teachers see themselves supporting the active school life in many ways, but involvement is the recurring theme. Many of the parent/teacher responsibilities are the same: a child with a supportive parent on one side and a supportive teacher on the other can only excel in the educational experience.

These responsibilities are not exclusive to either parents or teachers, but a sharing of responsibilities will help to produce a happy, well-adjusted child.
