- This Monday, Dec., 7, we will resume our in-person hybrid learning schedule for grades PreK-6. Cohort A students will report to their schools starting on Monday the 7th and Cohort B students will report back to their schools starting on Thursday, Dec. 10. Grades 7-12 will remain all-virtual.
- Next Wednesday, Dec. 9, **Brittany Woods will host a webinar for all parents** in grades 6-8 to provide updates and time for parents to ask questions.
