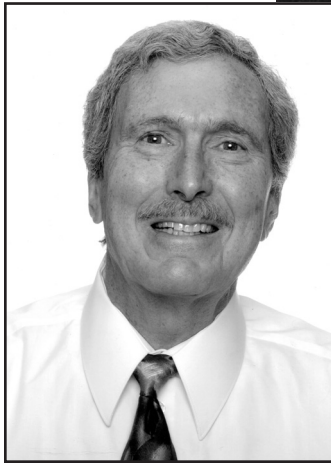
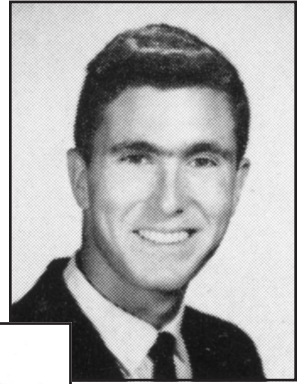
With a foundation in math, science and creativity instilled at University City High School, Dr. James Kornberg graduated from Massachusetts Institute of Technology with a BS and Masters in Aeronautical and Astronautical Engineering, earned a Doctor of Science in Environmental Health Sciences and Engineering from Harvard and an accelerated three-year MD degree from Dartmouth Medical School.

Board-certified in Occupational and Environmental Medicine under the American Board of Preventive Medicine and a fellow in the American College of Preventive Medicine as well as doctorates in both medicine and engineering, Dr.

Kornberg has built a career on an impressive, multi-disciplinary foundation... evaluating and/or treating more than 30,000 patients for occupational or environmental exposure and disease, developed and operated an environmental engineering and medical consulting firm, designed and implemented more than 150 medical monitoring programs and has testified as an environmental/medical causation expert more 60 times.

In 1992, he authored *The Workplace Walk-Through*, featuring his copyrighted methodology incorporated into the training for physicians seeking Colorado state certification to perform impairment ratings.

Kornberg retired from direct patient care, but continues to engage in interesting and challenging environmental and occupational health concerns from his Snow Drift Ranch in the southwest Colorado mountains. He is a rancher, author, columnist, consultant, seminar leader and trainer.
