Sanford E. Pomerantz, J.D.

Class of 1958

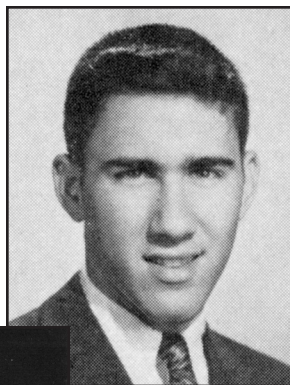
Sandford “Sandy” E. Pomerantz attended Jackson Park Elementary, Hanley Junior High, graduated from University City High School in 1958 and continued to earn his bachelor’s degree and Juris Doctoris from Washington University in St. Louis.

As an athlete, Pomerantz was a Parade Magazine All American basketball player at UCHS. Following high school, he played at the University of Cincinnati. As a sophomore, he lettered on the Cincinnati team that won the 1960 Missouri Valley Conference

Championship. After transferring to Washington University, Pomerantz averaged 22.5 points per game as a senior and earned All American honors in 1963. He also played on the United States basketball and volleyball teams in the 1961 and 1965 Maccabiah games in Israel, where he won a gold medal in basketball and a bronze medal in volleyball.

He has been recognized and inducted into the Washington University, Jewish and Missouri Sports halls of fame. He is a past president and lifetime member of the St. Louis Jewish Community Center and serves on the Washington University committee for Undergraduate Studies. Professionally, he is a member of the Missouri Bar Association and the Bar Association of Metropolitan St. Louis.

The former high school basketball star is still scoring record points as a partner with Goffstein, Raskas, Pomerantz, Kraus, Sherman, LLC.
