Foundation and the National Endowment for the Arts, and a residency at the Rockefeller Study Center in Bellagio, Italy. In 2000 he was awarded the Ruth Lilly Poetry Prize by *Poetry Magazine* and the Modern Poetry Association for his contribution to American poetry. In 2001 he published a book of prose on the craft of poetry, "Poetry as Persuasion," addressed to apprentice writers.

Having taught last fall his last class at the State University of New York at Buffalo, where he has been a Professor of English for over 35 years, he now holds the title of Artist-inresidence, and can devote himself more freely to his writing.
