
Ernest E. Green III

In 1988, when Ernest Green III was a rookie with the University City Police Department, he was shot in the stomach. The injury did not deter him from pursuing a career in law enforcement, nor his passion and commitment to community service.

Today, Captain Green commands the department's Bureau of Investigation. He is also a Deputy Commander for the St. Louis Metropolitan Major Case Squad.

Green is a 1982 graduate of University City High School. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Truman State University and a master's degree in

human resources and management from Webster University. He is a graduate of the National FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia, and has written articles for several law enforcement publications.

Green serves on a number of community boards including the University City Education Foundation, Regional Education Advocacy Coalition for HIV & AIDS, and the Adult Education and Literacy Foundation. He has participated in car/booster seat programs, reading campaigns and school supply giveaways. Additionally, Green often speaks at various civic events, churches, schools and universities.

U.S. Representative Lacy Clay honored Green's community service with a Special Congressional Recognition. He also received a proclamation from St. Louis Mayor Francis Slay and 100 Black Men of Metropolitan St. Louis that recognized him as a Trail Blazer and designated October 9, 2005, as "Ernest E. Green Day."

Green and his wife Alicia are the parents of two sons.
