Hammerman served as president and board member for the NCJW-St. Louis. She received NCJW national's Enduring Advocate for Social Change Award and the 2016 St. Louis chapter's Hannah G. Solomon Founder's Award. In 2017, the NCJW named her a Woman of Achievement for her life-long commitment to social justice. She helped install the NCJW Kids Community Closet at her elementary school, Barbara C. Jordon (formerly Daniel Boone) and has served on every UCHS Class of '69 Reunion committee since graduation!
