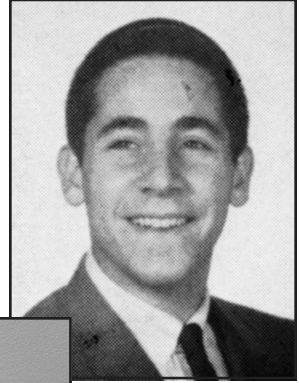


Dr. Sheldon L. Kaplan

Kaplan also is a past president of the Pediatric Infectious Diseases Society.

He is the author or co-author of 313 publications, and his research includes evaluating new antibiotics for children with infections caused by antibiotic-resistant bacteria.

He served on the Anti-Infectives Advisory Committee for the US Food and Drug Administration and chaired the sub-board of Pediatric Infectious Diseases for the American Board of Pediatrics.
