Mann founded OASIS for the purpose of providing and enhancing the quality of life for older adults through education, arts, humanities, health promotion, and volunteering. Because of this, Mann has received such awards as the YWCA's Leaders' Award, a bronze medal from the United States Surgeon General, Women of Achievement, and Women Who Make a Difference from the International Women's Forum.

The OASIS tutoring program matches senior citizens with students in first, second and third grades for one-on-one reading tutoring. Now in its fifth year in University City, our program boast more than 50 active volunteers in our schools, many of whom are tutoring more than one student.
