
Alan R. Spector

After graduating from UCHS in 1964, Alan Spector earned a bachelor of science in electrical engineering from the University of Missouri – Rolla.

Following a successful 33-year career with

He is currently working on his first novel. Spector has also lectured extensively in creative writing classes, at management and quality assurance workshops, and in retirement planning seminars.

His volunteerism includes receiving the Cincinnati United Way Community Leadership Award in 2006. He has volunteered with Every Child Succeeds, a Cincinnati-based in-home visitation program for atrisk families and was co-founder of the Cincinnati Initiative to Reduce Violence, a community initiative to prevent gang-related homicides.
