As a member of the inaugural class of the New School for Social Research's Jazz and Contemporary Music Program, Wilner entered into a period of intense study.

In 1994, he began to work regularly at Smalls Jazz Club. He got close to the enigmatic creator of Smalls, Mitch Borden, and in 2007, became partner and manager of the club.

For the last 12 years, Wilner has worked to maintain Smalls as a center for jazz in New York – home to veteran players and a hothouse for younger players to cut their teeth. In 2012, Wilner opened a second club, Mezzrow.

Over the years, Michael "Spike Wilner has toured with the Artie Shaw Big Band, the Glenn Miller Orchestra, and Maynard Ferguson.
