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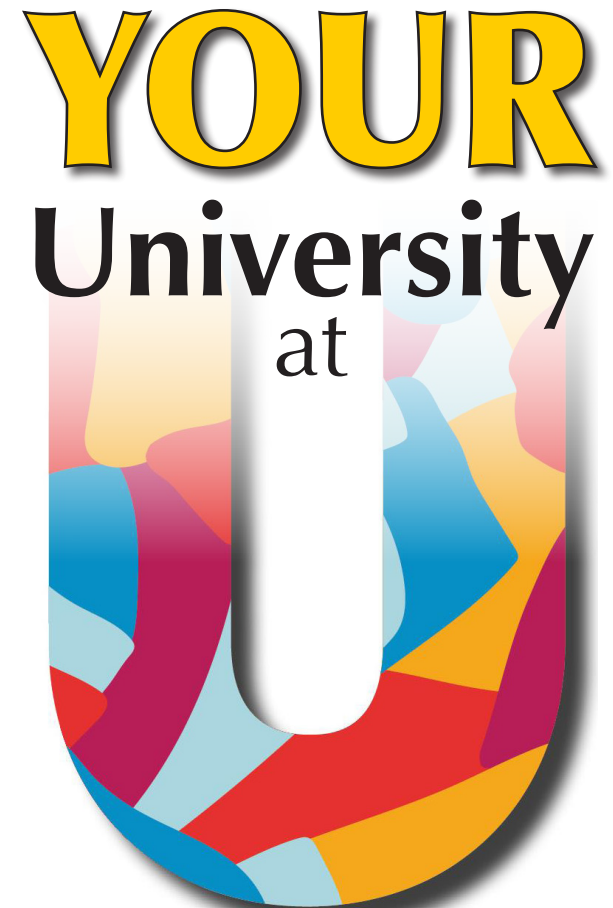

YOUR University at University City High School

In conjunction with **St. Louis Community College**, **St. Louis University** and **Missouri S&T**, [and potentially **University of Missouri - St. Louis**], University City High School offers a host of courses that allow students to accrue college credits while satisfying high school credits.

UCHS students may earn up to three (3) semester hours of credit for every dual credit course they successfully complete, or for every College Board AP (advanced placement) test they pass with a score of three (3) or higher.

According to Missouri law Core 42, students awarded college credits in high school will have the ability to transfer their credits to all public state postsecondary institutions.

UCHS offers the opportunity to obtain college credits for students not currently qualified to enroll in dual credit courses through placement in College Board's AP (advanced placement) curriculum.

As of the 2018-19 school year, UCHS began integrating the AP essential curricular elements into dual credit course offerings so as to create a single, hybrid course that works to serve all interested students who wish to obtain college credit while in high school.

For example, U.S. History dual credit is now designated as AP/DC U.S. History and both AP and dual credit students will attend the same class. Students who choose not to take the course for dual credit will have to pass both the class and take the AP exam in order to obtain credit. Dual credit students will only have to successfully pass the class to earn college credit.

Additionally, pre-AP and honors classes are offered for students wishing to prepare to enroll in AP/DC courses later in their high school career.

What is...

Dual Credit is college credit that can be earned alongside high school credit in classes taught by UCHS teachers.

Dual Enrollment is college credit that is earned by taking college courses taught by college instructors on the college campus, or by college professors coming to teach courses at the UCHS campus.

AP, formerly Advanced Placement, offers a course-end AP test administered by College Board, where students can earn college credit by scoring 3-5.

PLTW (Project Lead the Way) courses are career-focused, course path that affords college credit for fulfilling four (4) years of high school classes.

1818 courses are offered as AP, dual credit, dual enrollment or online options.
